Lesson #11: Summing up Godly Relationships (1 Peter 3:8-12)			
Our world is filled with heavy hearted people who are suffering the sorrow brought on by relationships. In response a whole industry has sprung up. Self-help books, groups that provide support, and the list could go on of those who seek to sell answers to the many who are suffering. Dear friend, Peter has a message of that I trust you will listen to and listen to carefully. Only God can provide tranquility to a trauma filled relationship.			
In the midst of ruined relationships I can think of no other advisement any more practical than the advisement to which we turn this morning. As we open to 1 Peter 3:8-13 we come to a passage that is packed with powerful and pointed instruction on how we should live our lives amongst the brethren.			
Picture Christ in Your Relationships (3:8)			
If you are going to know peace in your relationships you must relate to other lovingly. In verse 8 Peter gives some carefully and symmetrically arranged concepts that we need to see if we would relate to others lovingly.
